

<b>Neurology</b>	
<b>Service &amp; Target Population</b>	The Division of Neurology Clinics provide consult services to meet the needs of adult patients (17 years and older) with acute and chronic neurological conditions from anywhere within the Fraser Health region. This includes referring patients to sub-specialty services and ensuring linkages with appropriate Chronic Disease Clinics.
<b>Services</b>	<ol style="list-style-type: none"> <li>1. <b>Transient Ischemic Attack (TIA) Rapid Assessment Clinic or Stroke Prevention Clinic.</b> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>• This clinic is also referred to as the Stroke Prevention Clinic, and provides rapid consultation and short-term management of patients with symptoms consistent with a TIA. The mandate of this clinic is to assess patients within 72 hours of referral.</li> <li>• Although the focus is TIA Patients, urgent neurology patients are often scheduled into the same clinic and are given similar urgency and referral patterns.</li> </ul> </li> <li>2. <b>General Neurology Clinic.</b> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>• Provides consultation on degenerative, inflammatory, neoplastic, diagnostic, non-urgent vascular, hereditary, epileptic and other neurologic disorders.</li> <li>• Provides both diagnostic and longitudinal chronic care.</li> </ul> </li> <li>3. <b>Neurodiagnostic clinics (EEG/EMG/EP)</b> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>• Provides the only EEG services for Surrey, Delta, Langley and White Rock.</li> <li>• Provides comprehensive EMG/neuromuscular consultations.</li> <li>• Patients requiring further neurologic care or further non-neurodiagnostic investigations are often transitioned to the general neurology clinic.</li> </ul> </li> </ol>
<b>Service Highlights</b>	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>• Incorporates one of three Regional TIA Rapid Assessment clinics 5½ days a week.</li> <li>• Collaboration with patients, families and other healthcare workers to prevent illness and improve health outcomes. The focus is to improve quality of life for patients who are at risk for, or have, a neurological disorder.</li> </ul>
<b>How do I refer</b>	<p>Referral sources to the Division of Neurology Clinics are through emergency department physicians, general practice physicians, as well as physician specialists within any discipline.</p> <p>Currently there is no mechanism for self referral to these Clinics.</p>
