Service & Target Population	The purpose is to establish an interdisciplinary comprehensive outpatient urology service that includes a number of integrated and coordinated components provided at the Outpatient Care and Surgery Centre.
Services	<p>The components of the service are described below:</p> <p>Extracorporeal Shock Wave Lithotripsy</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> • Outpatients with kidney stones causing pain and blocking flow and < 1.5 centimetres. <p>Surgical Day Care</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> • Risk adjusted patients appropriate for same day surgical procedures requiring general or regional anesthesia. <p>Surgical Ambulatory</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> • Patients appropriate for surgical ambulatory procedures not requiring general anesthesia including cystoscopy, prostate biopsy, circumcisions and vasectomies. <p>Urology Clinics (four clinics)</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> • <u>Stone Follow-up and Prevention</u>: Interdisciplinary approach to management of stone disease. (dietician and nephrologist) • <u>Urodynamic Testing</u>: Diagnostic testing for urinary dysfunction including leakage or retention. • <u>Continence Management</u>: Focus on bladder and bowel assessment, education regarding control, treatment and support. Service offered by multidisciplinary team. (nurse continence advisor and continence physiotherapist) • <u>Prostate Health</u>: Primary focus on patient education regarding conditions associated with the treatment of prostate disease (e.g., incontinence and sexual dysfunction). Community linkages including an existing support group.
Service Highlights	<p>The Urodynamic, Continence and Stone Clinics and Electro Shock Wave Lithotripsy (ESWL) are new services being provided in the Outpatient Care and Surgery Centre.</p> <p>The ESWL technology will be a Fraser Health regional service.</p> <p>Urology services will be coordinated and more accessible to Surrey and Fraser Health (FH) residents. Residents will not have to travel downtown for urology services as in the past.</p>
How do I refer	<p>Referrals to the Urodynamics Clinic are by urologist, gynecologist, or uro-gynecologist.</p> <p>Stone Clinic referrals are post-ESWL.</p> <p>Continence Clinic referrals are open but complex patients may be referred</p>

	via specialists. Referral is faxed.
